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Plural Forms 名词复数

Rob: And hello, I'm Rob. This week someone's been asking about plural words.

Feifei: 名词复数。A plural is when there is more than one of something.

Rob: That's right. But today we've got just one guestion. Let's read the email

and find out exactly what it says.

Hi. I always have trouble pronouncing the plural form 's' for many words especially when the word ends 'es'. Can you please help me? I heard it is also the same for the possessive 's'.

Thank you. Samantha See, Beijing.

Feifei: 来自北京的 Samantha 提出了一个关于名词复数的问题。她不大清楚在名词单数后加

上字母 s 或 es 的发音。Don't we just say /s/ on the end of the word?

Rob: If only it was that simple. How you pronounce the ending depends on the

words you're using. With some noun words like these...

Bridge Sausage Friend

Rob: You just add the letter s and then it sounds like this...

Feifei: 以上的几个例子都是在名词后加 s 变复数。Rob, that almost sounds like 'z' at

the end. Friend-z.

Rob: That's the sounds you get if the word ends with a voiced consonant or it

ends with a letter that is a vowel - a,e,i,o and u.

Feifei: 如果一个名词以浊辅音结尾,那再加上字母 s 后的发音就是 'z'.

Rob: Are you falling asleep?!

Feifei: No, I was just talking about the /z/ sound! So when else do we pronounce

the /z/ sound on plural words?

Rob: Well, you also get that sound on plural words ending with es. Like this...

Feifei: 名词复数以 es 结尾的发音是 'iz'. /ɪz/

Rob: Come on Feifei, read these plural words and let's hear how they end.

Feifei: Ok here goes. Songs. Trees. Clothes. There's that 'z' sound again! So

that's pronouncing /s/ as /z/. But what about when a noun ends in an

unvoiced sound like p,f or t?

Rob: Then you end the plural word with a /s/ sound. Like this...

Feifei: That sounds different. It's a /s/ sound. 名词以清辅音结尾,变复数后 s 的发音

是 ssss.

Rob: Now you're sounding like a snake!

Feifei: Well I'm not! It seems the sound depends on the noun. But now you're

going to tell me there are exceptions?

Rob: Yes I am. I'm afraid there are. Just to confuse you, some words can end

with a /s/ or a /ız/ sound. Like youth-z or youth-s, bath-z or bath-s.

Feifei: 下面我们来谈谈名词所有格。Samantha has also asked about pronouncing the

possessive s.



Rob: This is when we usually add an apostrophe and then the letter s to a noun

when we want to say it belongs to something. Like this...

Jack's cooking is the best in the world! The dog's fur needed washing.

Rob: So, did you notice anything different?

Feifei: No!

Rob: That's because you pronounce the possessive s in just the same way as

the other plural endings that we've discussed – with a /s/ or a /ɪz/ sound depending on if the noun ends with a voiced or unvoiced consonant.

Feifei: 名词所有格形式 s 的发音和名词变复数的发音是一样的。希望我们的解释对

Rob: Yes, I hope that's a bit clearer but there are still just a few exceptions.

Feifei, how do you pronounce the plural of sheep?

Feifei: You can't trick me. The plural of sheep is...sheep!

Rob: I can't pull the wool over your eyes can I?!

Feifei: What?
