本词汇表以大学英语四级 CET4 词汇表进行制作的。

相比较网上常见的中文解释,本文全部的解释是用原版的英英词典(以 Longman English Dictionary 为主,以 Cambridge English Dictionary 为辅),对一个单词的不同意思进行了分开解释,以便于更快速的理解与学习。

非常建议你直接用全英文的解释学习英文单词,你不仅可以非常精准理解该单词的 真正意思,而且还可以了解这个单词如何地道的使用(例如造句,写作等等)。即 使你现在不能真正的用英英解释去理解单词,也建议你先看中文解释,再用英文来 进行校正。
